Where does God want us to be? (When we are standing before God, we will not be ashamed of what our church is trying to accomplish!)

How will we get there? (what new resources, skills, attitudes, or strategy will we need to be faithful, but do not yet possess?)

Tasks

Administration – though the work of the Committees on Nominations, Staff-Parish, Finance, and the Board of Trustees.

Ministry & Mission – through the work of the various teams, the council charts the direction of the church and shares that vision to ministry teams.

Connectional – through the Lay Member to the Annual Conference

Accountability – Do the various ministries understand their role as an essential part of the whole church, the needs they serve, and are they actively working to accomplish their goals in support of the vision.

Strategic – Discern the future. Where is God leading us? What problems will we face in the future if left unattended now? Capital Expansions, special projects that do not fall within normal ministries, develop a 3 & 5 yr plan

- report annually to the charge conference on the state of the church's property, equipment, investments, and resources
- Develop guidelines for authorizing the proper use of church facilities
- maintain adequate insurance coverage on all church property and develop appropriate risk management policies
- Submit to the Committee on Finance an annual budget requests for insurance, property maintenance and improvements.
- Accountable to charge conference and to the church council.

- Invest excess church operational income, (in a Godly way).
- Encourage bequests and memorial gifts, and invest such gifts
- Participate in the formulation of the final church budget



- Confer with, consult, and counsel the pastor and staff on matters pertaining to the effective

use of gifts, skills, and time to fulfill the mission and ministry of the church.

- Evaluate the staff/pastor in the role of ministry at least annually
- supporting lifelong learning for all staff (continuing education)
- To develop and maintain job descriptions for the lay and clergy staff.
- Develop salaries / benefits requirements for all paid staff positions.

Responsibilities

- Be open and responsive to the leading of the Holy Spirit
- Pray weekly for our church, church leaders and for God's vision
- To encourage others to participate in prayer vigils and study
- Intercede in prayer for others in times of Crisis
- Establish an effective pray ministry for new disciples to follow

We must move from asking God to take care of the things that are breaking our hearts, to praying about the things that are breaking His heart.

The Prayer ministry team comprises faithful men and women who commit to set aside 30 minutes each week in concentrated prayer for the needs of our church, our leaders, and the lost. Those who make this commitment are supplied with prayer requests from the church office each week. Many individuals have shared that this ministry has resulted in a deeper personal walk with the Lord Jesus Christ and that they have drawn closer to Him in times of praise, confession, intercession, and adoration.

Visitation Ministry



Purpose: Sharing a heart of connectedness, compassion, and faith.

Our visitation ministry demonstrates the love of Jesus Christ. Visitation expresses sincere interest in people and affirms their worth. The Church is

responsible for initiating and developing lasting relationships with the unchurched, the hurting, and the elderly.

Responsibilities

- Coordinate hospital visits individually or in teams
- Train volunteers with the spiritual gift of compassion / mercy
- Communicate special needs to pastoral staff
- Organize special events for shut-ins [birthday parties, card showers, etc.]
- Share Communion on a quarterly with shut-ins

Visitation can include,

- elderly or disabled people living in nursing homes
- people who are hospitalized or sick for a prolonged period of time
- bereaved people and their families
- people in crisis

- To coordinate dates of activities impacting the whole church with the Program Leadership and the Church Council and the church office.

And how is anyone going to tell them unless someone is sent to do it? That's why Scripture exclaims, A sight to take your breath away! Grand processions of people telling all the good things of God!" Romans 10:14-15 (Message)

Wow! That is what our Missions Ministry is all about. FUMC has a passion to be a mission-driven church, because we believe every person has a story to share about the great things of God. You can be a missionary right in your own neighborhood, making an eternal difference in the lives of people who live all around you, or by being a light that shines for Jesus where you work. As mission-driven church is centered around "being" and "doing." Being mission-driven means that we have experienced God's grace and simply want to share with joy what we have found. D. T. Niles once said,

"Evangelism is just one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread."

We believe that every member is "sent" to share what we have already been given. Being Mission-minded therefore is <u>participative</u> rather than simply <u>representative</u>. We are sent, we don't contract other to go for us.

At First United Methodist Church, we want evangelism to be the essence of the church rather than the expression of the church.
